A Message & News from the Minister

This is true:

John Wesley travelled 250,000 miles on horseback, averaging 20 miles a day for 40 years; preached 4,000 sermons; produced 400 books; knew ten languages. At 83 he was annoyed that he could not write more than fifteen hours a day without hurting his eyes, and at 86 he was ashamed he could not preach more than twice a day. He complained in his diary that there was an increasing tendency to lie in bed until 5.30 in the morning....

Wow! How many people in their 20s or 30s could claim so much? Let alone people in their 80s?

The truth is that we will always hear of some (extraordinary) person who can do X,Y or Z more effectively or faster than us, or with greater accuracy. There will always be someone who was a

better cook, who cleans houses more efficiently, who earns more, who can wear clothes from a charity shop and look like a million pounds and if we take their life as a standard we will always feel ourselves to fall short of the mark.

Some of us from the three protestant congregations in Long Buckby spent the second week in August running the Bible Holiday Club. We created many objects d'art- beauties in the eyes of the Beloved... and we shared Bible stories, jokes and much singing with actions.

I remember action songs from my childhood: "<u>Wide Wide as</u> the Ocean", "<u>How did Moses Cross the Red Sea?</u>", "<u>We are climbing Jacob's ladder</u>", "<u>Only a boy called David</u>" and "<u>The wise man built his house upon the rock</u>", amongst them. I can still remember the words and the actions.
