# A Message from the The Minister

# Breaking Away and Moving On

When the ocean liners of the P & O Lines were about to leave each port, those who stood on the decks threw to their friends and families standing on the quay a long rolled paper streamer, as they held tight to one end . Quickly the space between ship and shore was criss-crossed with a filigreed web of brightly coloured chord; each end held symbolically. The coloured streamers were slack as the great mooring ropes were cast off and slowly the liner began her reversal out of the dock. The slack in the thin paper threads was taken up, they became taught, stretched and one by one as the distance between ship and shore grew, they would break, leaving departing travellers and their loved ones on the dockside each holding half a broken thread as they poignantly fluttered in the wind.

The ship headed out to the open seas and away. Soon the harbour was a dot on the horizon, then it could be seen no more.

Moving away, moving on and even moving back, involve some kind of breaking- some pain, as ties are stretched and sometimes break. To move away, or on, is painful. Any loss is painful: whether it's changing school, moving house, changing jobs, facing retirement, coping with the loss of a loved one, or the prospect of moving into sheltered accommodation, to name but a few.

The story is told of Rev'd John Fawcett (1740-1817) that he had received a Call to change pastorate and had all the arrangements for moving, in place. His final service over, the wagon was loaded, when that night he had a change of heart, decided that he could not leave his present pastorate, sat down and wrote the hymn "Blest be the tie that binds"... and the next day he told the removers to unload the wagon!

People move to make new beginnings for many different reasonssometimes by choice, sometimes circumstances enforce a break. The Pilgrim Fathers undertook hazardous journeys in search of a new life and religious freedom; others broke away from traditional beliefs by dissenting but staying put and risking persecution. **COFFEE** - If you fancy a coffee a warm welcome awaits you - **Kilsby** is open for coffee and snacks every Monday and Thursday from 9am til midday.

# Church Leaders Deeply Saddened

Statement in response to the killing of Fr Jacques Hamel in Rouen, France

We are deeply saddened to learn of the brutal murder of our brother, 84-year old priest, Fr Jacques Hamel in Saint-Etienne-du-Rouvray, Rouen, France. That a man of peace who had dedicated his life to serving people could be killed during Mass is testimony to the evil that drives the actions of those who commit such a crime. We offer our deepest sympathy to his family, friends and parishioners. We pray for the wellbeing of those who were taken hostage, their families and the entire community served by Fr Jacques; indeed we pray for the peace of France, Europe, the Middle East and the world for which Jesus, the Prince of Peace, gave his own life.

We call upon all people of goodwill to pray and work for justice and peace. In particular, we implore everyone to help people everywhere to pursue the path of peace and human flourishing - which is the will of Creator God.
